Woodford Reserve Rye | 12

The drink emerged around the early 1880s and is regarded by many bartenders as one of the best cocktails to ever have been served.

Old Fashioned

Woodford Reserve Bourbon | 13

By the 1860s new liqueurs were in demand. Those who preferred simple drinks would ask for something more reminiscent of 1850, something more "old fashioned."

Martini

Hendrick's Gin | 14

The rise in popularity of this drink, which came about during Prohibition, is owed to the relative ease of making illegal gin.

Negroni

Hendrick's Gin | 12

While the origins of this cocktail are disputed, what is not up for debate are the cocktail's proportions—3 equal parts.

Gimlet

Hendrick's Gin | 12

Scurvy is never sexy, but the gimlet certainly is. The lime cordial it is meant to be made with became standard British Navy rations in 1867.

Americano

Dolin Sweet Vermouth | 10

In the pages of James Bond, before there was the famously shaken Martini, there was the Americano.



Signature Cocktails

Boyde

Woodford Reserve Bourbon - maraschino - honey syrup lemon, served on the rocks

Sicilia

Bombay Sapphire Gin - St Germain - lemon raspberry liqueur, served up

Key Wish

Woodford Reserve Rye - Cointreau - Fiero - Cynar grated cinnamon, served on the rocks

The Forty-One

Mezcal - Green Chartreuse - maraschino - lime sparkling brut finish, served up

Ginger Blossom

Grey Goose Vodka – ginger-orange – ginger beer – lemon, served up

Fancy Pirate

Bacardi Rum – St Germain – lime –ginger orange Angostura & orange bitters, served on the rocks

Old Curiosity

Woodford Reserve Bourbon - coffee - cardamom bitters vanilla - whipped cream, served in a rocks glass
